



## **Artificial Intelligence (AI) – Check In**

- How many of you have experimented with AI?

## **Current IB Policy on Al**


- If students use text or images from AI (such as ChatGPT) they must:
  - Put the text in quotation marks
  - Make clear it's from Al
  - Include details (including the prompt) in the bibliography
- Transparency students being clear what is their thinking and what they have found from other sources
- This approach applies to all AI generated work
- Details in annex of new IB Academic Integrity Policy and on the PRC



### **Example of Classroom Activity**

#### From IB's TOK curriculum manager

- This activity is intended to encourage students to think critically about the benefits and limitations of AI tools
- Introduction present class with two images generated by DALL:E
  - Request: A photo of an astronomer
  - Request: A photo of an biologist
- In pairs, students discuss what they notice about the 2 images.
- Bring to classroom discussion





## **How Education Might Change**

- Teach the new skills that are required in a world with AI software exists
  - For example: prompt engineering
- Emphasize the important of understanding and critical evaluation
  - Less time writing, more time thinking
- Emphasize the dangers of bias being built into AI models
  - Al learns from a body of work. If that body is biased or incomplete....
  - Why AI can produce wrong information
  - This is transferable to thinking about all claims made
- Empower those who are good thinkers but poor writers paradigm shift



#### **Conversations to Have in your Schools**

- What is it that Artificial Intelligence does for students that they could not get from another student?
- Do you think it is sensible to compare AI to google/spell checkers/graphical calculators. Can we learn how we incorporated these tools into our education?
- What is it we want students to learn in our classes. What is Al taking away from that?




## **PYP Transdisciplinary Themes Pilot**

#### The PYP Transdisciplinary theme trial: draft descriptors in schools

- The draft descriptors will be trialled in schools to support the development of support materials.
- o Timeline:
  - The trial will run between September 2023 till December 2023
  - Participating schools will be onboarded by August 2023









## **CP Partnerships**

#### Microsoft strategic partnership



Affiliated Evaluation (Pilot SY2024-2026)


















#### Goal 3



#### Period101

Period101 is a US 501(c)(3) dedicated to fighting period poverty - the lack of access to menstrual hygiene products. Rather than donate boxes of period products, Period101 creates personalized "period product kits." Period product kits are small bags filled with menstrual products, a motivational note, and information on where individuals can access menstrual products. Maya Manchester founded Period101 in 2022 after taking action during the pandemic to fight period poverty by hosting drives for local organizations in her community. Maya Manchester brought the first chapter of Period101 to Thomas A. Edison High School with the help of Laiba Ali. During the 2022-2023 school year, the Edison Period101 chapter created 600 period product kits, hosted educational events, and a letter-writing campaign to advocate for change in state laws. Period101 will be establishing chapters throughout Virginia, Washington DC, Maryland, and North Carolina during the 2023-2024 school year. Period101 will use the funds from this grant to grow the organization and the new chapters. #### The Sea Turtle Conservation Fund

The Sea Turtle Conservation (STCF) Education Program, is an initiative created by the Sea Turtle Conservation Fund (STCF). The STCF's mission is to conserve the global sea turtle population through fundraising and community education initiatives. The STCF Education program is a half-day educational experience that offers schools a unique opportunity to teach students about environmental protection through the captivating lens of sea turtle conservation. Our goal is to cultivate a deep sense of environmental responsibility among participating students. The program is completely free for schools, and the STCF provides all necessary materials such as worksheets, slide presentations, teaching guides, and more. By following the immersive storyline of a sea turtle's experience in the wild, the program breaks away from the conventional and unengaging "save the planet" narrative, and engages students in a meaningful way. 

# Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Alignment to Strategic Goals

In Year 1, we will focus on upskilling our staff and aligning internal processes with DEI principles; training and development activities; review of internal processes to ensure alignment with our IB's DEI goals and to DEI is embedded in ways of working IB-wide.

Year 2 will emphasize the review of internal infrastructure and resource allocation. Each Office and Department will assess their infrastructure and resources to meet their specific DEI goals and objectives.

In Year 3, we will deepen our DEI skills and assess our efforts to guide the formulation of new strategies for future DEI initiatives.







#### 1st Milestone

- Establish a baseline of DEI Competency for leaders and staff through training and development.
- Conduct a DEI assessment of Offices/Departments' internal processes.
- Develop metrics to monitor progress.
- Engage schools and regional associations in dialogue on DEI and work on guidance for school initiatives.

#### **2nd Milestone**

- Conduct a review of internal infrastructure and resource allocation to support DEI work.
- Ensure Offices/Departments' policies, procedures and practice meet DEI goals and objectives by providing infrastructure.
- Support implementation of initiatives in schools and regional associations.

#### **3rd Milestone**

- Deepen staff's organizational knowledge and build DEI competence and skills.
- Continue working on DEI goals and objectives and their implementation.
- Monitor and evaluate progress; develop future DEI strategies.
