IB Approaches to Learning across the Continuum:

Approaches to learning refer to those skills that students develop when they are learning how to learn and think effectively, and how to process information and manage their emotions: those skills that are currently identified as "Transdisciplinary skills" in the PYP. The ultimate intention of approaches to learning across the IB continuum is to develop self-regulated (self-managed, self-directed, independent) learners through skills-based, process-focused teaching.
