

IBMA Flash Chat Sessions

Flash chats are opportunities to discuss important IB issues which are on your mind. As part of your registration for this coordinators meeting, we asked you for topics and questions that you would like help with. This is not a presentation, instead it is a chance to gather around an issue that is critical to the success of IB Programs in your school or district.

Instructions

- 1. Randomly select a table to sit
- 2. Each table will have a prompt/question
- 3. You will have 7 minutes to discuss and take notes, provide feedback
- 4. Before you move to the next table, find an area on the wall to post your feedback
- 5. 3 minute transition time
- 6. Move to a table you have not sat and do not sit with anyone from your prior table.
- 7. 6 rotations
